

#### ACEC/MD ROLLS OUT 2017 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

ACEC/MD officially kicked off the 2017 political season at the organization's annual Legislative Breakfast on November 17th. The Business Agenda for the General Assembly Session, that convenes on January 11th, was rolled out and Maryland Businesses for Responsive Government (MBRG) President Duane Carey delivered the keynote address. During his remarks, Mr. Carey described the important role that owners and employees of Maryland businesses play in countering the anti-business agenda of many organizations that descend on Annapolis each year. He also stressed the importance of political contributions that allow representatives of ACEC/MD to explain issues that are often foreign to our elected officials.

This year's agenda will focus on strengthening the prohibition on a client assigning a duty to defend to consultants, eliminating barriers to fair competition on projects, and clarifying that engineering and related services are not subject to sales tax. In addition, ACEC/MD is working with the administration to eliminate the unfair transportation prioritization law that was enacted last year, and to defeat efforts to water down professional licensing laws due to bogus restraint of trade claims.

Be sure to mark your calendar for January 19th, and plan to join your colleagues at ACEC/MD's Legislative Action Day. We really need everyone's participation to ensure that our elected officials hear from their constituents. Plan on assisting ACEC/MD in lobbying for the following initiatives:

**INDEMNITY - DUTY TO DEFEND**

**WHAT IS THE ISSUE?** With passage of SB 234 and HB 871 in 2016, engineering and design firms obtained some relief from onerous "Duty to Defend" clauses in A/E contracts. There are still additional modifications required to ensure the obligation to pay defense costs and/or resulting economic loss arising out of the negligence of others, including the indemnities, are not passed on to design firms.



#### 2017 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA (CONTINUED)

## **INDEMNITY - DUTY TO DEFEND** (continued) **WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?**

- The Duty to Defend clause is an unfair allocation of risk.
- The Duty to Defend clause is uninsurable.
- This requirement contractually draws engineering firms into litigation when they have no negligence.
- Small businesses could be bankrupted from resulting expenses without any fault.
- Engineering firms could be indemnifying someone for their own negligence.

#### Legislative Action Required

Amend Section 5-401.2 of the Annotated of MD to delete the "sole negligence" requirement and to fairly assign negligence to the responsible party. Add "economic loss" to the damages resulting from the liability.

#### PROVIDING FAIR COMPETITION ON A/E CONTRACTS

**WHAT IS THE ISSUE?** The 2015 session included passage of House Bill 738, which modified the Annotated Code of Maryland with respect to jurisdiction over procurement issues. Additional modifications are necessary to address confusion in the procurement process regarding A/E firms' participation in the selection process. Current regulations state that if an individual or a firm assists a State agency in drafting a specification for a procurement contract that individual or firm is prohibited indefinitely, or as long as the State uses the specification in the procurement contract for which it was drafted or any other procurement contract, from helping anyone to prepare a bid or proposal for that contract.

#### WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- Existing regulations deprive firms the ability to participate in certain procurements if they employ an individual that assisted in the drafting of any specifications used for the procurement. Contract specifications are regularly used on projects that the original drafter had not intended.
- Current laws place unreasonable requirements on a firm to know everything employees worked on from start of their careers.
- Would not change the requirements of the ethics law contained in State Government Article, Title 15, Subtitle 5.

#### Legislative Action Required

Modify language on participation in A/E procurement process. Establish clear guidelines with prescribed timeframes that outline specific requirements for participation in State procurements.

#### REJECTING SALES TAX ON ENGINEERING SERVICES

**WHAT IS THE ISSUE?** During an audit of a Maryland engineering firm by the Comptroller's office, an auditor incorrectly identified certain services and activities performed by the engineering firm as being subject to Maryland state sales tax. This resulted in assessment of back taxes to the engineering firm for the services in question. The services taxed were part of usual and customary professional services performed by an engineer and should not be subject to sales tax.





#### 2017 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA (CONTINUED)

### REJECTING SALES TAX ON ENGINEERING SERVICES (continued) WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- Engineering services are professional services that are historically not subject to sales tax.
- The Comptroller's interpretation of taxation of these professional services was inappropriate and could spill into other design professions including architecture, landscape architecture, inspection and surveying.
- Assessment of back taxes, legal fees and economic loss that result from the inappropriate classification of these services can bankrupt small businesses.
- In 2007, when the MD Legislative looked at sales tax on professional services legislators agreed that the services of A/E firms should remain exempt from sales tax.

#### Legislative Action Required

Specifically define services provided by professional engineers and design firms to eliminate this from occurring again.

- Defeat efforts to raid money from accounts dedicated for infrastructure funding.
- Reject efforts to apply sales tax to engineering and related services.

ACEC/MD hosted a Maryland STEM Festival event to offer students the opportunity to explore different engineering careers via a series of stations and hands-on workshops. Professionals representing engineering firms from all over Maryland demonstrated the exciting, varied and rewarding world of consulting engineering, and the contributions they make toward everyday life. Stations included:

Homeschooled students joined classes from Edmonston Westside High School, Sykes-ville Middle School, and Woodlawn High School. Groups of five to 10 students rotated through stations representing each discipline, many of which included hands-on exercises. Presenters answered questions that ranged from highly technical inquiries to the coursework and curriculum necessary to pursue an engineering career. Students enjoyed seeing underground hydrology in action, watching bridges collapse, building structure foundations, planning a roadway, storytelling through geographic information, surveying the atrium of the beautiful Engineer's Club of Baltimore, and much more.

Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) jobs are growing at a fast past, yet U.S. colleges and universities are not producing enough graduates in the required fields. The decision to pursue a STEM-related career is often made during the critical middle and high school years, when students begin to focus on more challenging math and science coursework.
